	Cycle parking at the new Tesco in Maryhill: Councillor Craig Mackay to investigate.	СМ
	Cycle routes through parks: these are convenient and pleasant during daylight hours, but parallel road routes must exist for commuting etc during hours of darkness.	
	<ul> <li>Main road cycling, for those who want a direct route to their destination.</li> <li>The opening up of stopped-up roads to allow cyclists to use quieter back streets.</li> </ul>	
	<ul> <li>Petition to the Scottish Parliament: Sandra suggested that Go Bike petition the Scottish Parliament to ask for consultation on traffic orders on the same grounds as other road users. Go Bike committee to discuss at next committee meeting.</li> </ul>	Go Bike committee
