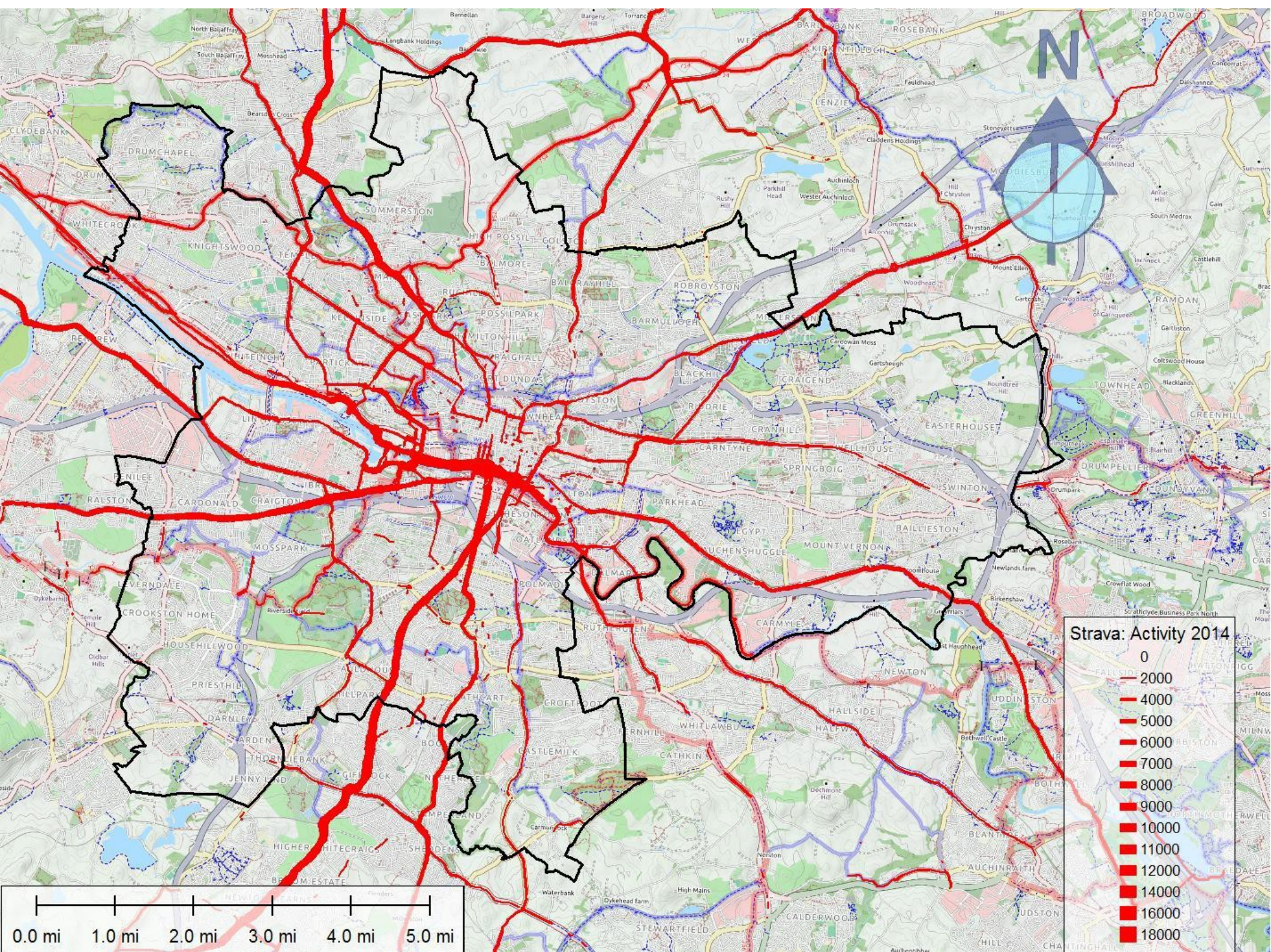

Resolutions

Glasgow has some of the poorest quality cycle provision in the UK, only some is due to poor quality highway maintenance. At present money is being spent by the local authority that is not value for money.

Agree to prepare a report identifying examples of poor quality provision of cycle facilities, the authority responsible for them, describing faults and indicating, where appropriate, what should have been provided when they were constructed.

Investigate the possibility of raising funds to retain an expert to report on the resources and expertise currently available to Glasgow City Council to provide cycle provision, its deficiencies and what is needed to improve provision.

- A Safer Cycling City: Key Outcome 4 on page 17
