Glasgow City Council proposes to consider the introduction of the above named Traffic Regulation Order in terms of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984.

The order will affect the residential area generally bounded by Garscube Road to the east, Maryhill Road to the west and New City Road to the south.

This Order would propose the following:

- No waiting and no loading/unloading at any time restrictions
- Car club parking place at Hinshaw Street and Clarendon Place
- An electric vehicle parking place at Hinshaw Street and Clarendon Place
- A prohibition of driving ((Except Pedal Cycles) at North Woodside Road.
