

School Streets, Glasgow (Prohibition of Motor Vehicles) (Experimental Traffic Regulation) Order 201_

Glasgow City Council proposes to consider the introduction of the above named Traffic Regulation Order in terms of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984.

Glasgow City Council's Traffic and Road Safety Unit are in the process of progressing a pilot project of School Car Free Zones. The initiative will be delivered in 6 schools in Glasgow, which is due to be launched at the start of the new school term in August and will be in operation for up to 18 months. There has been public demand from parents, residents, education staff and elected members for the School Car Free Zones, which will ban motor vehicles from streets outside or around school entrances.

The list of roads affected by these proposals are:

Arrochar Drive, Broadlie Avenue, Caldwell Avenue, Elmwood Avenue, Elmwood Lane, Lourdes Avenue, Lourdes Primary School Access Road, Otago Street, Tarfside Gardens, Westbank Quadrant

Details of the proposals are as follows:

- **Prohibition of driving on the above roads, between Monday to Friday, 0830 hours and 0915 hours, then between 1430 hours and 1515 hours.**

A copy of the Draft Order, relevant map, statement of reasons and detailed report for proposing to make the Order are available for inspection 9am – 5pm, Monday to Friday inclusive at Reception, Exchange House, 231 George Street, Glasgow, G1 1RX.
