

### **Laurieston Phase 2 (20mph Speed Limit) Order 20\_\_**

Glasgow City Council proposes to consider the introduction of the above named Traffic Regulation Order in terms of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984.

The Council have been made aware of potential road safety issues within the area of the new Laurieston Phase 2 housing development. Therefore, as part of the Laurieston Phase 2 housing development, it is considered necessary to reduce the mandatory speed limit from the existing 30mph to 20mph due to an anticipated increased volume of traffic in the area.

The roads affected by these proposals are generally bounded by: **Norfolk Street to the north, Gorbals Street to the east, Cumberland Street to the south and Eglinton Street to the west.**

The list of roads affected by these proposals are: **Abbotsford Place, Apsley Place, Bedford Lane, Bedford Street, Coburg Street, Eglinton Court, Herbertson Street, Kilbarchan Street Margaret Street, Nicholson Street, Norfolk Court, Portugal Street, South Portland Street, Stirlingfauld Place.**

Details of the proposals are as follows:

- 1. The implementation of a mandatory 20mph speed limit zone**
- 2. Zone entry/exit signage; and**
- 3. '20' roundel markings.**
