

Carmunnock Road (Service Road) (Traffic Regulation) Order 20__

Glasgow City Council proposes to consider the introduction of the above named Traffic Regulation Order in terms of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984.

The proposals will introduce a one – way system to assist with current road safety issues being experienced by the existing two-way traffic flow on Carmunnock Road (Service Road). Additionally 'no waiting at any time' restrictions, in the form of double yellow lines, will also be established in the area where parking is deemed unsafe or undesirable and to assist with servicing for local businesses a loading only bay for all classes of vehicle will be introduced. The existing taxi stance on Drakemire Drive will also be refurbished and made enforceable as part of these proposals.

THE LIST OF ROADS AFFECTED BY THESE PROPOSALS ARE

Carmunnock Road (Service Road), Drakemire Drive, Drakemire Drive (Service Road), Farnie Drive, Fetlar Drive, Seil Drive, Unnamed Service Road between numbers 361 Carmunnock Road and 11 Crofffoot Road.

THE MAIN FEATURES OF THE PROPOSALS ARE

- No waiting at any time restrictions
- One way operation
- Loading Only Place, 8am – 6pm
- Taxi Stance, 24 hours, 4 taxis.
