

Auldhouse Road (Traffic Management) Order 202_

Glasgow City Council proposes to consider the introduction of the above named Traffic Regulation Order in terms of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984.

The Council have been made aware of road safety and congestion issues with the existing two-way traffic flow on roads within the Auldhouse area. To address these issues, a traffic management plan is being proposed which includes the introduction of one way operations to improve the flow of traffic, the introduction of 'no waiting at any time restrictions' in the form of double yellow lines where parking is deemed unsafe or undesirable and the introduction of 'prohibition of vehicles (except for access)' restriction to protect privately owned lanes.

THE AREA AFFECTED BY THE PROPOSALS IS BOUNDED BY:

Riverford Road, Kilmarnock Road, Nether Auldhouse Road and Auldhouse Road.

THE LIST OF ROADS AFFECTED BY THE PROPOSALS ARE:

Alloway Road, Beaufort Avenue, Doonfoot Road, Ellisland Road, Glenspean Street, Kirkoswald Road, Lochlea Road, Mamore Place, Mamore Street, Mossgiel Road and Riverford Road. The lanes to the rear of 17-45 Lochlea Road and 342-360 Kilmarnock Road are also affected.

DETAILS OF THE PROPOSALS ARE AS FOLLOWS:

The proposed Order will comprise of:

1. The introduction of one way operations
2. The introduction of no waiting at any time restrictions
3. The introduction of prohibition of motor vehicles except for access restrictions.
