

### **Cardonald Area (Traffic Regulation) Order 202\_**

Glasgow City Council proposes to consider the introduction of the above named Traffic Regulation Order in terms of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984.

#### **BACKGROUND TO THE PROPOSED ORDER**

Due to requests received over the course of several years from residents and Local Members for a variety of new restrictions within the Cardonald area, the Council has decided to promote this Traffic Regulation Order in order to encompass these proposed new restrictions. At this stage, we invite you to provide comment on the proposals.

#### **AREA AFFECTED BY THE PROPOSED ORDER**

The area affected by these proposals is shown on the attached plans. The area is bounded by:

- Queensland Drive to the north, Tarfside Avenue to the east, Tarfside Avenue to the south and Forfar Avenue to the west.

#### **THE LIST OF ROADS AFFECTED BY THESE PROPOSALS ARE**

- Forfar Avenue, Forfar Avenue Lane, Kingsland Drive, Kirriemuir Avenue, Kinross Avenue, Lintlaw Drive, Queensland Drive, Queensland Lane East, Queensland Lane West, Tarfside Avenue.

#### **THE PROPOSED ORDER (AS DEPICTED ON THE ATTACHED PLANS) WILL COMPRISE OF**

- The implementation of a one way system on Forfar Avenue and Kinross Avenue.
- The implementation of a 'No Waiting at any time' restriction on Tarfside Avenue at Lourdes Secondary School.
- The implementation of a 'Prohibition of Driving except for cyclists' restriction on Queensland Lane East at Kingsland Drive and on Queensland Lane West at Kingsland Drive.
- The introduction of "No Waiting and No Loading at any time" restrictions at the junction of Lintlaw Drive and Queensland Drive.
