	IS prepared a statement that TC and Joseph Heenan will deliver to the hearing that includes these asks councillors to push council officers to:	
	 Urgently work with Police Scotland to allow for the division of space on Finnieston Street, to allow for an active travel lane. 	
	 Engage with GoBike to discuss issues we have with the proposed diversions, and to consider some diversion solutions we have found. 	
	 Ensure that all diversions are suitable for people who currently use the traffic free 	
	National Cycle Network that will be lost during COP - and that the diversions are SAFE, PHYSICALLY PROTECTED and DIRECT.	
	We are calling these Conference Active Travel Lanes. New Cycling by Design guidance should be out before diversion routes are put into place and hope is that painted lanes will not be acceptable as the "minimum" they have been promising.	
	Patrick Harvie raised support for our campaign as a motion in parliament but subsequently had to withdraw the motion as in his new position as minister he is not able to submit motions. We have since requested a meeting with him to let him know where we see he could help but no response has been forthcoming as of yet.	
	We've also had press coverage in the Scotsman, Glasgow Times and STV	

News, all covering the campaign positively.

Pedal on COP

Pedal on Parliament are heading up the 'Wheeling Bloc' at the Global Day of Action March for Climate Justice on Saturday November 6th. We will be using the THIS MACHINE FIGHTS CLIMATE CHANGE message and we think it is really important that GoBike is represented there.

We have a number of feeder rides from around the UK and from all corners of Glasgow to help people cycle to the march. Each feeder is being run by a diverse range of cycling groups and GoBike is being represented by an Andy Preece feeder ride coming in from Clydebank direction. Other groups so far involved also include OnBikes, Cycling Uk Glasgow, GoBike and Friends of Bearsway (being organised on a GoBike channel) and the Southside Womens Road Cycling Club.
