### NOTICE OF PROPOSALS

# **Kelvin Way**

#### (Traffic Management) Order 202\_

Glasgow City Council proposes to consider the introduction of the above named Traffic Regulation Order in terms of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, as amended.

The purpose of this Order is to restrict through traffic along with supporting sustainable transport options on Kelvin Way. Therefore enabling safer and more sustainable travel options within the local area and connections to the wider network.

THE ROADS AFFECTED BY THESE PROPOSALS ARE BOUNDED BY Sauchiehall Street to the south and University Avenue to the north.

THE LIST OF ROADS AFFECTED BY THESE PROPOSALS ARE Kelvin Way.

#### **DETAILS OF THE PROPOSALS ARE AS FOLLOWS**

#### NO WAITING AND NO LOADING AT ANY TIME

- On the eastern side, from the extended north kerbline of Sauchiehall Street, northwards to the extended south kerbline of University Avenue.
- On the western side, from the extended north kerbline of Sauchiehall Street, northwards for a distance of 60 metres.
- On the western side, from a point 80 metres from the extended north kerbline of Sauchiehall Street, northwards to the extended south kerbline of University Avenue.

# NO WAITING AT ANY TIME, NO LOADING OR UNLOADING EXCEPT BY GOODS VEHICLES

From a point 60 metres north of the extended north kerbline of Sauchiehall Street, northwards for a distance of 20 metres.

#### PROHIBITION OF VEHICLES EXCEPT PEDAL CYCLES

From the extended north kerbline of the Kelvingrove Art Gallery and Museum Car Park Access Road, northwards to the extended south kerbline of University Avenue.

#### ONE WAY OPERATION

Northwards, from the extended north kerbline of Sauchiehall Street to the extended north kerbline of the Kelvingrove Art Gallery and Museum Car Park Access Road.

#### PROHIBITION OF RIGHT TURN

It is proposed to retain the existing Prohibition of right turn restriction, from the Kelvingrove Art Gallery and Museum Car Park Exit Road to Sauchiehall Street.

#### PROHIBITION OF BEING IN A TWO-WAY CYCLE TRACK

On the east side, from the extended north kerbline of Sauchiehall Street to the extended north kerbline of the Kelvingrove Art Gallery and Museum Car Park Access Road.



## **Report**

#### 1. Background to the proposals

It is proposed to formalise the changes to the measures introduced on Kelvin Way as part of the Spaces for People programme during 2020, as a response to Covid – 19 and following the City Administration Committee approval granted on the 16<sup>th</sup> of September 2021.

### 2. Association with Transport Strategies and Council Policies

The promotion of this Traffic Regulation Order will help to improve safety, accessibility and increase the use of active travel modes on Kelvin Way and helps to support the following transport strategies/Council policies;

#### 3. Proposals

Details of the proposed Order:

## No waiting and no loading at any time

It is proposed to amend the existing no waiting and no loading at any time restrictions on Kelvin Way at the locations described below.

- On the eastern side, from the extended north kerbline of Sauchiehall Street, northwards to the extended south kerbline of University Avenue.
- On the western side, from the extended north kerbline of Sauchiehall Street, northwards for a distance of 60 metres.
- On the western side, from a point 80 metres from the extended north kerbline of Sauchiehall Street, northwards to the extended south kerbline of University Avenue

#### No waiting at any time, No loading or unloading except by goods vehicles

It is proposed to introduce a No waiting at any time, No loading or unloading except by goods vehicles restriction, on Kelvin Way at the location described below.

 From a point 60 metres north of the extended north kerbline of Sauchiehall Street, northwards for a distance of 20 metres.

# Prohibition of vehicles except pedal cycles

It is proposed to introduce a Prohibition of vehicles except pedal cycles restriction, on Kelvin Way at the location described below.

• From the extended north kerbline of the Kelvingrove Art Gallery and Museum Car Park Access Road, northwards to the extended south kerbline of University Avenue.

#### One way operation

It is proposed to introduce a One way operation, on Kelvin Way as described below.

• Northwards, from the extended north kerbline of Sauchiehall Street to the extended north kerbline of the Kelvingrove Art Gallery and Museum Car Park Access Road.

### Prohibition of right turn

It is proposed to retain the existing Prohibition of right turn restriction, from the Kelvingrove Art Gallery and Museum Car Park Exit Road to Sauchiehall Street.

# Prohibition of being in a two-way cycle track

It is proposed to introduce a Prohibition of being in a two-way cycle track restriction, on Kelvin Way as described below.

 On the east side, from the extended north kerbline of Sauchiehall Street to the extended north kerbline of the Kelvingrove Art Gallery and Museum Car Park Access Road.
