

Glasgow City Council would like to update you on the latest designs and how the **Flourishing Molendinar** project will progress to construction.

We will share how your input has helped shape the designs for **Provanmill Road, Royston Road, Langdale Street and Cumbernauld Road.**

In the designs you will see:

- ◆ Pedestrian improvements including, wider footways and step-free crossings at side roads
- ◆ Enhanced walking, wheeling and cycling priority signal junctions
- ◆ Creation of public space on Langdale Street
- ◆ New high quality kerb segregation to replace the plastic armadillos between the cycle track and carriageway
- ◆ Narrowed carriageway to reduce vehicle speeds and improve safety
- ◆ Locations for new street trees

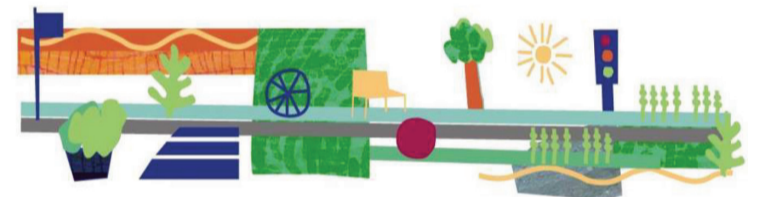
The aim is to help more people to walk, wheel and cycle for everyday journeys, such as pupils getting to school. Everyday activity improves people's health and wellbeing, whilst being environmentally friendly.

Flourishing Molendinar

Is a project that will improve the streets in the local communities to make it easier for people to walk, wheel and cycle in the neighbourhood.

From 2020 to 2022, St Paul's Youth Forum were awarded a grant by Sustrans to work with the community and create concepts for how the streets could look.

Glasgow City Council have since developed these concepts into detailed designs.
